
#### WHO ARE WE

Madhabnagar of Kakdwip block, the organisation works for the upliftment of rural people irrespective of caste, creed and race. SSJS also has two project offices; one at Rajnagar, Birbhum and the other at Maithon, Jharkhand.

The organisation is registered under West Bengal Societies Act 1961. Registration No. S/67639 of 1991-92 dated 26 April 1991 including Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) 1976, Ministry of Home Affairs, Gol vide renewal registration No. 147110370 dated 6 May 2017. Also registered for the exemption of u/s 80G, 12A, PAN, TAN of IT Act, 1961 and Professional Tax under IT Act. SSJS is affiliated to Credibility Alliance, Guidestar India and Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS).








### Project Safe Drinking Water for Health & Hygiene of Poor and Backward Community





With the generous support of Hindustan Colas Pvt. Ltd, SSJS installed a total of 16 deep tube wells for providing safe drinking water in Kulpi block of South 24 Parganas. 10 tube well were installed in Kamarchawk Panchayat and 6 in Chandipur.

With the installation of these tube wells a total of 18,266 beneficiaries now have easy access to clean and safe drinking water.

### **Impact of the Project**

- The community now have access to good quality, clean and safe drinking water
- Drinking water shortage greatly reduced
- Time to fetch water from tube well remarkably reduced. Earlier women had to travel at lengths to fetch water. This has enabled them to spend more time for households activities.
- Water borne diseases are less. Medical cost saved. Better health for people.
- Community members are now aware about health, hygiene and cleanliness issues.





### Project Safe Drinking Water for Health & Hygiene of Poor and Backward Community



In another separate project Hindustan Colas Pvt. Ltd. supported two Panchayats of Kulpi block with 15 deep tube wells. 12 tube wells were installed in Ramkishorepur Panchayat and 3 in Rajarampur Panchayat. Around 15,750 people will reap the benefits of these tube wells.



### **Impact of the Project**

- Good quality clean and safe drinking water is now easilyt available to the community members.
- It has helped in reducing drinking water crisis in the area
- Women are now able to spent more time for household works as the time to fetch drinking water has been greatly reduced
- Community members have been made aware on good hygiene and cleanliness.
- Prevalence of water borne diseases is reduced. This has saved their medical expenses.




## Project Health & Hygiene by way of Safe Drinking Water (Hand pump)



SSJS installed 5 deep tube wells in Durbachati Panchayat of Patharpratima block with the financial support of National Insurance Company Limited to ease the safe drinking water crisis in the area. These tube wells will benefit around 4,800 people of the area.







### **Impact of the Project**

- The community now have access to good quality, clean and safe drinking water
- Drinking water shortage greatly reduced
- Time to fetch water from tube well remarkably reduced. Earlier women had to travel at lengths to fetch water. This has enabled them to spend more time for households activities.
- Water borne diseases are less. Medical cost saved. Better health for people.
- Community members are now aware about health, hygiene and cleanliness issues.



## Project Installation of Tube Wells (Hand pumps) to Ensure Safe Drinking Water to the Backward Community





In order to reduced safe drinking water crisis in parts of Patharpratima block of South 24 Parganas, Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL) supported the installation of 9 deep tube wells.

These tube wells were installed in Durbachati Panchayat. As a result of these tube wells 9,574 beneficiaries will not have easy access to safe drinking water.

### Project Plantation of tree by Individuals Under Swachhata Pakhwada



With the aim of promoting bio-diversity and protect the environment, Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited provided 1,090 fruit plant saplings to beneficiaries. These saplings were distributed to beneficiaries in Kakdwip and Patharpratima block of South 24 Parganas in the month of July 2020 and will impacts the lives of more than 5,000 people. The distribution was done maintaining all COVID 19 protocols.

### Project Distribution of Dry Ration to Families of Migrant Labour affected by COVID 19



With the support of Zomato Feeding and Uttoran Foundation SSJS provided dry rations to 1,500 families of migrant labour severely affected by COVID 19 Pandemic.



### **Impact of the Project**

1,500 poor families of migrant labour received dry ration to tide over the crisis created by COVID 19 Pandemic. It helped them meet their immediate food requirements for a few days.






## PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCIES

Humanitarian Assistance and
Risk Communication Awareness
to Vulnerable Migrant Population
Affected by Covid-19





The projects reached out to more than 12,000 families or approximately 60,000 beneficiaries in its attempt to generate awareness on COVID 19 pandemic. Group meetings, posters and leaflets were used to make people aware of the dangers of corona virus and prevention. The project also supported with unconditional cash transfer of Rs. 6,000 to 875 poor widow and migrant families, directly impacting the lives of around 5,250 beneficiaries. The project was implemented in Kakdwip and Patharpratima block. SSJS provided full ground planning and logistical support for the project.






### **Impact of the Project**

- More than 60,000 people were made aware on the risks of corona virus and ways to prevent it.
- 875 families received unconditional cash amounting to Rs. 6,000 directly to their bank accounts to purchase things that they need to survive the the crisis situation created by the pandemic.









ADRA India supported 878 families in Kakdwip and Patharpratima block with Non Food Items (NFI). These families were among the most vulnerable and suffered loss due to cyclone Amphan. The NFI kits contained cooking utensils, medicated mosquito net, solar lamp, bucket and masks. A total of 4,390 beneficiaries were covered under this project. SSJS offered planning and logistical support for this project.

### **Impact of the Project**

Poor and vulnerable people had suffered a heavy loss due to cyclone Amphan. The NFI kits proved to be very beneficial for the people. Items like cooking utensils, bed sheets, bucket, solar light and medicated mosquito net were very much appreciated by the beneficiaries.











## Project Emergency Relief to Cyclone Victims in India

Supported by ADRA

ADRA India with the financial support of Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region , distributed Shelter and Hygiene kits to 3,928 families in 7 blocks of South 24 Parganas. These were Kakdwip, Patharpratima, Sagar, Namkhana, Kulpi, Mandirbazar and Diamond Harbour. Around 19,640 beneficiaries were covered through this distribution.

The Shelter kit contained, tarpauline sheets, medicated mosquito net, bed sheets, cooking

utensils, bucket, mug and solar light. The hygiene kit contained bathing and washing soap, toiletries, face mask etc. FUNDED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THE HONG KONG SPECIAL ADMINISTRATIVE REGION

### **Impact of the Project**

The Shelter and Hygiene Kits distributed among the cyclone Amphan affected households proved to be very useful. The cooking utensils, bedsheets, and solar lamp was much appreciated by the beneficiaries. The hygiene kit provided at the time of COVID 19 pandemic turned out to be beneficial to them. It kit included masks, soap which people said were very useful.

# Project Humanitarian Assistance to Hospitals with PPE Kits for Frontline Workers (Doctors and Nurses) for COVID-19 response





Oxfam India, through SSJS provided 350 Personal Protective Equipments (PPE) to the hospitals for its frontline workers involved in COVID 19 management. These PPE kits were distributed to Kulpi Rural Hospital, Belpukur PHC, Panchagram Rural Hospital and Naiyarhat Rural Hospital.

The kit contained one body coverall, mask, nitrile gloves and bio-waste bags.

This was a significant support by Oxfam India to the health facilities and contributed greatly to COVID 19 management by the rural hospitals.





## Project Inner Wheel Club Calcutta Midtown Joint Project Ambuja Rejuvenation of Village Water Bodies in Kakdwip



Under the project IWC Calcutta supported in renovating three ponds in Srinagar Panchayat of Kakdwip block. These ponds were first cleaned, the water hyacinth plants were cleared, the pond was deepened and banks were restored. The purpose of rejuvenating water bodies was to enable these water bodies to turn into potential income generators for the village women. After the pond renovation works, the upkeep of each of these ponds were given to SHGs. The members of the three SHGs were also given ducklings and feed. Each member received 10 ducklings each.



■ The adolescent girls were sensitised on reproductive health and hygiene.






### Project Sundarban Rural Library

## Recognized by National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE) Affiliated to WBUTTEPA and WBBPE








SUNDARBAN B.ED COLLEGE is run under the auspices of SSJS. This is a leading college of South 24 Parganas, offering B.Ed Degree to students. Nestled in a beautiful campus, Sundarban B.Ed College offers a calm and serene environment for the students. The excellent faculty at the college offer students the freedom of to innovate, experiment and explore different methods of teaching thus instilling confidence and skills among them. The prospective teachers are taught how to gain attention of the students so that they try to learn the knowledge the teachers impart.

The college offers low affordable fee with instalment facility for students coming from poor

background and has a capacity of 200 students per year.

The campus also houses SUNDARBAN PRIMARY TEACHERS TRAINING INSTITUTE offering D.El.Ed certificate level teacher training programme that equips candidates to become Primary school teachers. The course basically caters to elementary level education in India and is an important job-oriented programme in the field of education.

Elementary education is imperative for the development of a better society and D.El.Ed helps in achieving just the same. Candidates who successfully complete D.El.Ed course come out as skilled and qualified elementary school teachers. Such teachers can find employment



opportunities at any institute imparting elementary education such as government schools, private schools, private tuition centres, day care centres, and so on. The course has an intake capacity of 100 per year and offers low course fee.

Both Sundarban B.Ed College and Sundarban Primary Teachers' Training Institute is recognized by National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE) affiliated to WBBPE, WBUTTEPA.

SSJS with funds from its own coffer provides free health checkup, treatment and nutrition support to women with the aim to improve their anemic conditions. The project runs in Kakdwip & Diamond Harbour Sub-Division. 1,500 families receive the benefits of this programme.

### Project Child Care Centre




SSJS support 100 children with nutrition and educational aid and prepares them for a better future.






